



ONE-SKEIN CROCHET SCARF

I designed this because I wanted a scarf that was warm and long enough so I could wrap it around my neck a couple of times but still have length in the front to show off the pretty stitch work. I also wanted the scarf to be cute and feminine, which would be a nice change from the mundane wool scarves I was seeing in stores. You can add more or take away from the beginning chain of stitches to alter the length, as long as it's a multiple of 4 + 3 stitches. This one was made with a large ball of yarn, but you can make a shorter one with a smaller skein. It's a perfect and pretty pattern for a beginner!

SCARF:

With larger hook, ch 203 loosely.

Row 1 (WS): With smaller hook, dc in fourth ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn—201 sts.

Rows 2-3: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in each dc across, turn—201 sts.

Border

Rnd 1 (RS): Skip first 2 sts, ** *shell in next st, skip next st, sl st in next st, skip next st; rep from * across to last st, sl st in last st, working across short edge of scarf, skip first row-end dc, shell in next row-end dc, sk next row-end dc, working across opposite side of foundation ch, sl st in first ch, skip next st, rep from ** around, sl st in top of first dc of row 3 to join. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

FINISHED SIZE: 3½" wide and 96" long.

MATERIALS

Yarn: Patons Classic Merino Wool

(100% wool; 3½ oz [100 g]/233 yd [205 m]):

1 skein of #00240 Leaf Green

Hooks: Sizes K or 10½ (6.5 mm) and L or 11 (8 mm) crochet hooks **or sizes needed to obtain gauge.**

Notions: Yarn needle.

Gauge: 8 sts and 6 rows dc = 4"

Stitch Glossary

ch: chain

sl st: slip stitch

rep: repeat

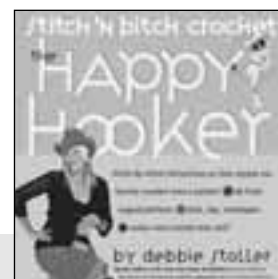
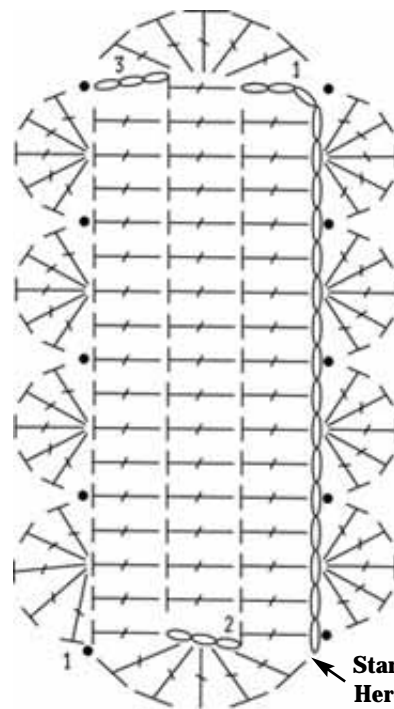
RS: right side

dc: double crochet

st(s): stitch(es)

shell: 5 dc in same st

WS: wrong side
